Robert Arnott, a member of the Liverpool Medical History Society, is an Honorary Lecturer in Ancient History and Archaeology and Apothecaries Lecturer in the History of Medicine in the University of Birmingham. His research interests centre around palaeoepidemiology and medical practice in the Late Bronze Age societies of the Aegean and Anatolia.
