

LORNA CREIGHTON KINLOCH

General Practitioner. Born 2nd November 1928. Qualified MB ChB Glasgow 1951. Died 22nd May 2018, age 89.



Lorna Kinloch was born in Greenock, Scotland, on 2/11/1928 the eldest of two daughters of a Colonial Medical Officer and GP.

She graduated from Glasgow Medical School in 1951, initially working in Glasgow and Scunthorpe.

Between 1953 and 1955 she lived in Moscow during very interesting times early in the cold war. Her husband, Peter, was Medical Officer to the British Embassy.

The mother of two boys she returned to work on Merseyside as a Rheumatology Clinical Assistant in 1961 and as a part time GP in 1967, joining her husband as his equal partner in his single handed practice in Halewood in 1973. A member of the Liverpool Medical Institution since 1975, she was a keen GP trainer. She became a magistrate in 1981. Peter and Lorna were joined in practice by their son Tom in 1985. They retired together in 1989.

In her retirement she enjoyed travel. She had a passion for golf. A member at Childwall Golf Club for over 40 years, she had the honour of being Lady Captain in 1987 and first lady member of Council in 2002. She founded the Autumn Tournament, played for by the ladies of all local clubs.

In her latter years Lorna had a stroke which made it hard for her to speak but she soldiered on enjoying life to the full until suffering another stroke from which she subsequently died on 22/5/18, aged 89 yrs. She is survived by her two sons and their families.
